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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE...

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Today we celebrated the Feast of the Most Holy Name of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which originated in Spain and is the name of our Parish. Our students participated in a number of Super School Activities and our fantastic P&F provided a sensational BBQ lunch for the students. We finished the day with a beautiful Mass to celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Name of Mary.

Of course, the name "Mary," being the name of the Blessed Mother, deserves special respect and devotion, and is thereby celebrated in four ways: First, *Mary* is a name of honour, since the faithful praise Mary as the Mother of our Divine Saviour; she is rightfully called "Mother of God," for Jesus true God, second person of the Holy Trinity entered this world becoming also true man through Mary. Second, *Mary* is a most holy name, because the very mention of her name reminds us she is full of grace, has found favour with God, and is blessed among all women. Third, *Mary* is a maternal name, because she is our Mother, whom our Lord gave to us as He was dying on the cross (cf. John 19:26-27). Finally, *Mary*, is a name of the mother who responds to all of our needs, protects us from evil, and prays "for us sinners now and at the hour of our death."

As we celebrate this feast day, let us remember one of the prayers shared at today's Mass: "*Lord, our God, when your Son was dying on the altar of the cross, He gave us as our mother the one He had chosen to be His own mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary; grant that we who call upon the holy name of Mary, our mother, with confidence in her protection may receive strength and comfort in all our needs.*" May our Blessed Mother continue to protect us, especially those Christians suffering persecution, and help us celebrate all that is good in our community.

MESSAGE FROM PARRAMATTA CITY COUNCIL

Council, in conjunction with Spot Parking Finder, have developed an online portal which outlines the parking restrictions outside all Primary Schools in the City of Parramatta Local Government Area for any given time in the day. This portal is designed to be used as a *pre-planning tool* for parents, grandparents or guardians to park safely and legally near their child's school, particularly during drop off and pick up times. It is not available as an 'app' as we do not want to encourage or appear to endorse the use of a mobile phone whilst driving, nor provide the temptation! Smart City - Safe School Parking in Parramatta

Child safety is greatly affected by speeding and illegal parking around school drop off and pick up zones.



The City of Parramatta teamed up with Sydney start-up Spot Parking to use technology to better educate people driving their children to and from school.

The Safe School Parking Finder is a pre-journey planning tool to show drivers where they can park safely around schools. Parents new to a school, or people who don't normally drive the children will find it extremely useful.

Many drivers do not realise that there are increased fines and demerit points in active 40 km school zones. The Safe School Parking Finder can show busy parents the safe options, and avoid any risks and fines.

The Safe School Parking Finder covers over 60 schools and includes translation in over 15 community languages.
