### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE...

Dear Parents,

Thank you to the many parents able to attend the first P&F meeting of the year (22 families were represented last night). There was very good discussion around many topics and great plans are in place for P&F events this year. We also had an excellent presentation from the Road Safety Officers at Parramatta Council – some of their presentation is shared in this newsletter.

In the Principals report I shared some of the plans for 2019 including:

- Fantastic start to our Year with 60 Kinder students plus 12 new families joining us in Years 1-6.
- There was great support again from the P&F for our Tea and Tissues morning. – thank you!
- Beautiful start with our Opening School Mass thanks to Fr Peter & Father Pio.
- Our goal in Religious Education this year is a deeper understanding of our faith, in literacy it continues to be 'writing' and in numeracy it is around 'thinking mathematically'.
- Continue to expand our resources in the area of STEM / STEAM – robotics
- Playground improvements Marist Playground especially under the trees along the fence line
- Sunrise weather this Thursday all welcome
- Enrolments are steady across the board
- Parental Education Planned 'Think You Know', literacy, numeracy sessions
- Some projects for 2019 include devices that no longer connect to our network are being replaced. This is being deployed this week including 40 iPads, 10 Chrome Books and a new laptop
- Sick Bay has been renovated (completed in the last week of last term) better storage and more space for students. The next project will be the front office and foyer with renovations planned to be completed during the next holidays.

### **ROAD SAFETY...**

**Parramatta City Road Safety Officers** presented some very good advice for keeping our children safe around traffic. Some of what was shared included:

### <u>D0</u>

- · Familiarise yourself with the parking restrictions around your school using SPOT Parking Finder
- Allow enough time each day
- · Teach your child to use the traffic lights or pedestrian crossing
- · Always hold your child's hand when you are crossing
- Drop and collect your child from the kerbside
- · Consider parking further away and walking
- Slow down to 40kph

### **DON'T**

- Call out to your child from across the road to come to you
- · Use your mobile phone whilst driving
- · Conduct a U-turn in a school zone
- · Rush or speed

SPOT Parking Pty Ltd in conjunction with Council has developed an online portal for every school within the LGA, it includes;

- User walkthrough/tutorial
- Translated to 13 languages (in addition to English)
- · Interactive maps displaying;
- · School boundary
- · Green areas where parking is allowed
- Yellow areas drop off/pick up zones
- · Red zones no parking permitted at any time
- · Penalty amounts for each offence
- Information is relevant to the time/day chosen
